Intro to Horses I

This is an introductory program aimed to teach the student all the basics of horses and riding. Students will learn everything from proper leading and grooming to how to recognize and care for injuries. Mounted sessions are divided into small groups to ensure each student gets the proper attention needed from qualified licensed instructors. At the end of the program we will have a games day and awards ceremony.

Intro to Horses II

This is a continuation of Intro I, however the programs are designed so that it is not mandatory to take in order to enroll. All programs start with a refresher so that new students can learn basics and returning students can help teach others what they have learned.

In this program we will learn things like bathing and teeth to gaits and bandages. Mounted sessions are divided into small groups to ensure each student gets the proper attention needed from qualified licensed instructors. At the end of the program we will have a games day and awards ceremony

Basic Horsemanship I

This program discusses everything from shoeing and hoof care, bits and aids and an intro to supplements. It is a little more advanced but still simple enough for a beginner/ intermediate student. Mounted sessions are divided into small groups to ensure each student gets the proper attention needed from qualified licensed instructors. At the end of the program we will have a games day and awards ceremony

Basic Horsemanship II

This program is a little more detailed. Some of the discussions include hoof damage, bad shoeing, colic, bowed tendons, difficult horses and how to work with them and clipping. Mounted sessions are divided into small groups to ensure each student gets the proper attention needed from qualified licensed instructors. At the end of the program we will have a games day and awards ceremony.

We will be adding more programs in the future based on responses from our students and parents input.
